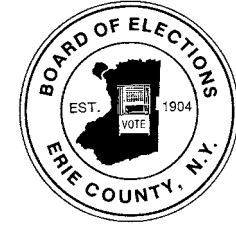

SIGNATURE REQUIREMENTS FOR DESIGNATING AND OPPORTUNITY TO BALLOT PETITIONS

Election Law §6-136

5% of the enrolled voters of the political party in the political unit (excluding voters in inactive status) or the following, whichever is less:

For any office to be filled by all the voters of:

The entire state.....	15,000
(At least 100 or 5% of enrolled voters from each of 1/2 of the congressional districts)	
Congressional Districts.....	1,250
State Senatorial Districts.....	1,000
State Assembly Districts.....	500
County Legislative Districts.....	500
County-wide offices.....	2,000
All elective town offices.....	500
All elective offices in the Cities of Lackawanna and Tonawanda.....	500
Delegates & Alternates to the Judicial Convention.....	500
State Committee Members (male & female).....	500

Apr 18	First day for signing independent nominating petitions. §6-138(4)

June 30	Last day to decline after acceptance if nominee loses party primary. §6-158(11)

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CHANGE OF ENROLLMENT

Feb 14	Changes of Enrollment are effective immediately; except those filed between Feb. 15th-July 5th. Change of enrollments filed between Feb. 15th-July 5th will take effect on July 5th.
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CHANGE OF ADDRESS

Election Law §5-208(3)

June 12	Notices of change of address from registered voters received by June 17 by a county board of elections must be processed in time for the primary election.
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ABSENTEE VOTING

Election Law §8-400(2)(c), 8-412(1), 10-114(1)

June 12	Last day for board of elections to RECEIVE application or letter of application by mail or online portal for primary ballot.
June 26	Last day to apply in person for primary ballot.
June 27	Last day to postmark primary election ballot. Must be received by the county board of elections no later than July 4th.
June 27	Last day to deliver primary ballot in person to the board of elections or your poll site, by 9pm.

MILITARY/SPECIAL FEDERAL VOTERS

Election Law §10-106(5), §11-202(1)(a)(b)

June 17	Last day for board of elections to receive application for Military/Special Federal/UOCAVA absentee ballot for primary if not previously registered.
June 20	Last day for board of elections to receive application for Military/Special Federal/UOCAVA absentee ballot for primary if already registered.
June 26	Last day to apply personally for Military ballot for primary if previously registered.
June 27	Last day to postmark Military/Special Federal/UOCAVA ballot for primary. Must be received by the board of elections no later than July 4th.

GENERAL ELECTION

November 7

POLLS OPEN 6:00 am - 9:00 pm

REGISTRATION

Oct 28	Last day application must be received by board of elections to be eligible to vote in general election.
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CHANGE OF ADDRESS

Election Law §5-208(3)

Oct 23	Notices from change of address from registered voters received by October 28th by a county board of elections must be processed in time for the general election.
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ABSENTEE VOTING

Election Law §8-400(2), 8-412(1), 10-114(1), 11-212

Oct 23	Last day for board of elections to RECEIVE application or letter of application by mail or online portal for general election ballot.
Nov 6	Last day to apply in person for general election ballot.
Nov 7	Last day to postmark general election ballot. Must be received by the county board of elections no later than November 14th.
Nov 7	Last day to deliver ballot in person to the board of elections or your poll site, by 9pm.

MILITARY/SPECIAL FEDERAL VOTERS

Election Law §10-106(5), §11-202(1)(b)(c)

Oct 28	Last day for board of elections to receive application for Special Federal/UOCAVA absentee ballot for general if not previously registered.
Oct 28	Last day for board of elections to receive application for Military absentee ballot for general if not previously registered.
Oct 31	Last day for board of elections to receive application for Military/Special Federal absentee ballot if already registered.
Nov 6	Last day to apply personally for a Military absentee ballot for general if previously registered.
Nov 7	Last day to postmark Military/Special Federal/UOCAVA ballot for general. Must be received by the board of elections no later than November 20th.
